Sure, it's generous enough. Participation in the program entails a one-time fee and a pay-as-you-go patent licensing agreement. ObjectVideo will even waive past damages for amnesty program participants.

But the **IP Amnesty Program** also underlines the fact that ObjectVideo is running over the industry with a legal steamroller that already has companies as big as Sony and Tyco under its wheel.

"With over 45 domestic and international patents awarded and more than 40 pending, this is an opportunity for industry partners to license our patent portfolio without the risk and cost of litigation," says Raul Fernandez, chairman and CEO of ObjectVideo.
